Improvement is key for S-O boys this winter

Core group is back from last year's 1-21 team

With six returning letterwinners and a pair of starters back, the season looks promising for Sibley-Ocheyedan's boys' basketball team.

Coach Brandon Bergfeld greeted 23 young men when preseason drills began. Of that number, five are seniors along with six juniors, six sophomores and six freshmen.

That total includes returning starters Beau Jen-

ness and Carter Brouwer, and four other letterwinners in Logan Bruxvoort, Keagan Van Westen, Vance Hayenga-Johnson and Dougie Noonkester.

This experience, however, is just one of the Generals' strengths this season, according to Bergfeld.

"Playing from both the perimeter and in the post is a strength," he said. "We have a good mixture of posts who can take up

space and score as well as guards who can attack the paint. We also have long and strong defenders who can match up with a variety of teams."

On the other hand, Bergfeld has two main areas of concern.

"We only have 11 guys suiting varsity as of now," the coach said. "Injuries would hurt our depth."

Bergfeld went on to note shooting is also a question mark.

"Last year we struggled from three-

point range but we're hoping summer and offseason time spent in the gym can help that," he said. "We weren't able to get as much time to work on our team stuff or individual skills during the summer as we normally do because of COVID. We also missed out on summer tournaments."

The coach's goal for the season is to be more competitive and finish games.

"We had a lot of close games slip away from us last year," he said. "We want to come out on the other end of those this

year."

If the Generals accomplish this, they will be able to reach the coach's other goal – finishing in the top half of the conference.

The Generals are fully capable of improving on last year's 1-21 mark and moving up in the league. Asked about the always-tough Siouxland Conference, Bergfeld pointed to defending state champs Boyden-Hull. He reiterated his belief S-O can climb into the upper half of the league.

Wealth of experience is big asset for H-M-S boys

Defensive improvement, varied lineups additional strengths

Experience and improvement may be two key ingredients for success as Hartley-Melvin-Sanborn enters

the 2020-21 boys' basketball season.

Hawk coach Mark Petersen enters his third year with the program and is seeing several familiar faces from the 2019-20 squad that finished 9-14 overall.

The eight returning let-

ter winners include seniors DJ Doyle, Ben Haack, Sam Heyn and Kayl Jacobsma; juniors Mason Brinkman and Jordan Ortega; and sophomores Lance Berends and Kooper Ebel.

Berends was named to the all-War Eagle Conference first team last year after leading H-M-S in scoring, rebounds and blocks. Ebel was honorable mention allconference. He led the team in assists and steals, was second in rebounds and third in scoring.

"The returning letter winners saw a reasonable amount of time on the floor last season. Everyone at some time of the year started games. We've got a wealth of expe-rience coming back," Petersen said.

Like all other programs, H-M-S did not have regular spring and summer workouts due to COVID-19 restrictions. But that didn't stop H-M-S players from finding ways to work on their skills.

"A lot of these kids were at the parks when they were back open, getting shots and playing," he said. "I know they were getting shots up and shooting competitive shots. That's a good thing.'

That commitment to getting better has carried over into preseason practices.

"The kids are working hard. They're a close knit group. They like each other and like competing with each other," Petersen

Defense and versatility, along with good size and guard play, are additional strengths of this year's team.

"Defensively we'll be improved. They seem to be communicating better," Petersen said. "We are able to throw different lineups on the floor - a power lineup or a shooting lineup. I think we're going to be able to match up against some different teams."

He also mentioned the importance of leadership on the squad.

"We've got kids that are vocal leaders up and down the lineup. They're coaches on the floor," Petersen said.

While Petersen and assistant coach Tom Lidiak see much to like about the squad,

they still stress the basics of the sport.

"The focus has to be shooting, rebounding and defense," Petersen noted. "We've got some great teams on our schedule. We've got to be able to play well."

Those teams include Gehlen Catholic, South O'Brien, Unity Christian and West Sioux as contenders in the War Eagle Conference. West Sioux tied for the title last year with Remsen St. Mary's, which was hit hard by graduation losses.


H-M-S finished the 2019-20 season with a 4-6 conference record, tied with Gehlen Catholic and Harris-Lake Park for seventh place. Petersen didn't forecast a finish for 2020-21, but he is confident the Hawks will do their best.

"It's going to be an exciting year, a challenging year," he said. "I want to see the kids get better every day and continue to be the quality people they are. They want to get better. They work hard."

Young talent is key asset for S-O girls

Generals eyeing Top 5 Siouxland finish

One might seriously consider betting the farm on Sibley-Ocheyedan's girls this winter.

The Generals, under second-year head

coach Steve Kellen, return all five starters from a year ago and are intent on improving on last year's results. Of the 26 girls out this season, three are seniors, six juniors, 11 sophomores and six freshmen, meaning there will be plenty



of competition in practice. The total is an increase of six girls from a year ago.

"Even with all five starters back, all the players are vying for starting positions," Kellen revealed.

In addition to their experience, Kellen is excited about two other aspects of the team.

"One of our strengths is our height. We have four girls who are six-feet tall on the varsity," he said. "Our guard play is very good. They all have the confidence to shoot the ball."

While the Generals have many strengths, Kellen still sees weaknesses in his team.

"We are still trying to get the girls into my system," he said. "We need to execute our offense and defend the ball better."

The Generals posted a record of 8-14 overall and 6-12 in Siouxland play a year ago. The team shot just 36.3 percent (427/1176) from the field, 27.6 percent (110/399) from three-point range and 63.2 percent (182/288) at the foul line. Individually, Madison Brouwer averaged 15.2 points and 9.8 rebounds per game

while Bria Wasmund kicked in an average of 12.9 points and 4.7 assists. Kellen plans to continue with his continuity offense against both man and zone defenses.

"It will use ball screen action that will allow the guards to attack the basket while allowing the post players room to

roll and utilize a high-low," he explained. The coach has definite expectations about the upcoming season.

"Last year there were really no expectations other than improving daily," Kellen said. "This season will be different. Last year we finished 8-14. We will improve from last year. I think a goal should be to get over .500."

Kellen is also eyeing a Top 5 finish in the Siouxland Conference. He pointed to West Lyon as the "cream of the crop" in the league.



Half-court defense, rebounding are strengths for Hawk girls

Finding scoring options will be early-season priority

Hartley-Melvin-Sanborn will rest its hopes for a successful girls' basketball sea-

son on solid defense and rebounding while finding its identity on the offensive end of the floor.

Leading this year's squad are senior letter winners Olivia Grooters, Taya Mason and Darby Mastbergen, juniors Lydia Harders and Jasmine Lux, and sophomore Elise LESTER

Haack. Senior Paige Gehrke, junior Emily Otto and sophomore Emily Mutombo are also on the varsity roster.

Having lost three of the top scorers from the 2019-20 team that finished 7-16 overall, H-M-S has to build offensive chemistry and find point production in game situations.

"We're looking for offensive leaders," said Hawk coach Lester Tessum. "We're hoping someone steps up and wants to be the leader on the scoring end of things."

Lux was third in scoring last year at just under six points per game and was also third in rebounds with 101. Grooters was close behind with 93 rebounds while Mason led the defense with 53 steals.

The offensive philosophy remains consistent in Tessum's second year at H-M-S.

"We want to take as many shots in the paint as we can and limit turnovers," he said.

Since the coronavirus pandemic interrupted plans to focus on fundamentals during the summer, early-season practices are stressing the basics.

"We do fundamental drills every practice – defense and dribbling," Tessum noted. "The first year you're teaching the philosophies you want to coach to. This year they



know what to do defensively and how we want to run plays.

"The girls have really bought into our pressure half-court defense," he added. "We will be as strong as we were last year right off the bat."

With five players listed at 5'9" or taller, H-M-S has the height and also the attitude to compete under the basket. "I fully expect we will be a good offensive rebounding team. We run our plays to have good offensive rebounding position," Tessum said. "Rebounding is pretty much effort. I think the girls will give us a really good effort."

H-M-S's player rotation will be limited in the early going.

"We'll probably be rotating seven girls

"It's one of the toughest conferences in girls' basketball, I think," Tessum said.

Teams that Tessum mentioned as title contenders - MMCRU, South O'Brien, Unity Christian and West Sioux - were all near the top of last year's standings.

In addition to teaching skills of the game, Tessum continues to use basketball as a means of showing his players what it takes to be successful off the court.

"Almost every practice we talk about life lessons. I relate basketball back to life," he said. "We try to build responsibility and a good work ethic."

One newcomer to the program is assistant coach Naet Hoaglund. The H-M-S graduate's previous head coaching experience at Spirit Lake is already an asset to the program.

'He understands basketball very well," Tessum said. "He has a good understanding of the kids and how to motivate them. He's been a really good addition."



Eleven already own varsity letters.

"We have a strong senior class who are providing great leadership. We also have some promising underclassmen in the room," Krogman said, acknowledging the team's strengths.

With all these positives, Krogman noted the Generals will probably go into meets




