coach Jay Eilers is pleased with the Hawks' approach to preparing for the season despite having had few outdoor practice opportunities.

"I'm extremely impressed with how our athletes have handled the weather and their willingness to compete. Their character has allowed us to get better on a daily basis," he said.

Eilers expects the Hawks to fill out a meet lineup. Their strength rests in the sprints and sprint relays which will be led by three seniors.

"We feel very strong with Ethan Diehm, Ryan Borden and Kooper Ebel coming back from very good sprints and relays from a year ago," he said.

"We look forward to Jr Araiza (junior) or James Gellerman (sophomore) to fill that open position and help us reach our goal of qualifying for state."

H-M-S's 4x100 relay team placed second at the 2022 War Eagle Conference meet and fifth at state. The 4x200 team was 10th overall at state and Diehm placed 10th in the long jump. Qualifying events to compete in Des

Moines is a big part of H-M-S's goals.

"Getting back to state is no guarantee but we are going to keep that in the forefront and make sure our kids are fresh when it counts, and work on the small detail things such as starts, hand-offs and creating a competitive mindset. We are competing against ourselves at all times," Eilers observed.

Competing indoors last month at

the IATC Indoor Championships and the Dan Lennon Invitational provided chances to observe what the Hawks can do.

"They have given the coaching staff an opportunity to evaluate what we are good at and what we can improve on," Eilers said. "Overall we have staved







# Inexperienced Hawk boys working hard to improve

Playing well and with poise is emphasis for 2023 season

With the loss of three seniors and others who did not return from last year's squad. the Hartley-Melvin-Sanborn boys' golf team is short on numbers for the 2023 sea-

There are just nine players on the roster, with no juniors or

freshmen among them. But the cupboard is not completely bare. Top returners include seniors Lucas Kroese and Charlie Conway, and sophomore Jack Mastbergen.

Mastbergen stood 36th and Kroese was 55th in the 2022 War Eagle Conference individual standings, and Conway has some varsity experience as well.

Other team members are seniors Ethan Baker and Caison Kruger, and sophomores Aiden Bush, Slayton McCarter, Blake Meendering and Dominic Tripp.

Despite the lack of returning players, Hawk coach Mark Japenga sees some positives with this year's team.

"We won't be real experienced, but we have some hard working kids that will put in the work to get better," he said.

Determining who will fill open varsity positions is a work in progress. Japenga, in his fourth year with the program, hopes to settle on a lineup by the second week of April. He is not sure whether H-M-S will have six players consistently competing in

"That remains to be seen at this point," he commented.

It will also be the second week of April before the Hawks can play competitively, as home meets on April 3 and 4 have been

postponed to later in the spring.

Defending WEC champion Akron-Westfield had three sophomores finish among last year's Top 20 individuals, but Japenga feels that Unity Christian might be considered the leading contender for 2023.

H-M-S finished eighth in the conference dual standings in 2022 with a 3-7 record. The Hawks also finished eighth at the WEC tournament. Japenga feels it's too early to tell how they may finish this year.

To play the best we can and stay calm and collected in any and all situations," he observed. "We want to improve as a team and handle stressful situations with grace and poise.'















"I'm excited that we have the experi-

"With all of the returning players and a limited number of golfers, this won't be an issue," she said.

ence champion in the 400 meters, 800 meters, 1500 meters and a member of the champion 4x400 relay team. Last year she also qualified for state in those events, where she finished third in the 800 and second in the 1500.

Madison Marco finished second in the Siouxland Conference a year ago in the 3000 meters. She qualified for state a year ago in the 1500, 3000 and 4x400. She finished ninth in the 1500 and 10th in the 3000.

Alayna Wingate was the runner-up in the conference 400-meter race, the event in which she placed 10<sup>th</sup> at state. She also qualified in the 100-meter hurdles, 400-meter hurdles and the 4x400.

Olivia Hensch also has state experience as a member of the 4x400 relay.

"Our returning state qualifiers and the experience of our upperclassmen is always a benefit to set the tone for meets and practices," Block said.




