

# S-O boys look to fill holes created by graduation

Generals aiming to improve on 9-12 2020-21 record

This year's edition of Sibley-Ocheyedan's boys' basketball team has an increase of two players despite losing five

players to graduation. The roster shows three returning starters as well as two other returning letterwinners.

Logan Bruxvoort is one of the returning starters. He finished last season with 160 points, 133 total rebounds including 82 from the offensive

glass, 12 assists, 12 steals and 11 blocked

Keagan Van Westen totaled 109 points, 83 rebounds, 57 assists and 28 steals, while Jonny Santana posted 107 points, 86 rebounds, 31 assists, nine steals and 11 blocked shots. Joining the trio of returning starters are senior letterwinners Michael Frick and Creighton Cosgrove.

The quintet contributed to the team's

1,122 total points, 172 offensive rebounds, 412 defensive grabs for a total of 584 boards, 247 assists, 143 steals and 75 blocked shots.

"Size, post play, senior leadership and team defense are our strengths this year," said coach Brandon Bergfeld. "My concerns are shooting consistency and depth."

The Generals are, and will be, working hard to reach their goals. According to the coach they include competing with every team, having a better than .500 record and winning a tournament game.

Bergfeld is confident the team can improve from last year by "communicating on defense and limiting possessions of each game."

"We won't be a team that's going to win 70-80 point shootouts. We'll be competitive by winning ugly 40-50 point slugfest type games," he said.

As for the team to beat in Siouxland Conference play, Bergfeld pointed to Boyden-Hull, which has reached the championship game in each of the last three years. He also noted Central Lyon and Rock Valley as strong contenders.

# Time of transition as Hawk boys hit the hardwood

Revamped lineup, aggressive style of play among changes

There are some changes in store this winter for the Hartley-Melvin-Sanborn boys' basketball team.

One change is at the top, where H-M-S graduate Naet Hoaglund succeeds Mark Petersen as head coach and head football coach Jay Eilers is the new assistant. There will be others. H-M-S must replace seven 2021 graduates, five of whom

were leaders in several categories, and the pace of play and aggressiveness are going

Hoaglund takes over a program that finished 13-10 last year, which was its best record in five years. He feels the transition has been "pretty smooth" and credits that to players' desire to be successful and do the right things.


While graduation losses will be noticeable, Hoaglund can rely on two returning juniors who have been key contributors since they were freshmen.

Lance Berends, first team all-War Eagle Conference and a Class 1A all-substate selection, led H-M-S with 363 points, 225 rebounds and 43 blocks. Kooper Ebel, also first team all-WEC, scored 256 points and topped the squad with 96 assists and 50 steals.

Developing the right player combinations to join the two "workhorses" may take time.

"Honestly, it's wide open right now. I have a general idea but 3-7 or eight are fairly interchangeable," Hoaglund noted. "It's just a matter of me figuring out which pieces work best together. A lot of it is dictated on matchups.

Senior Jordan Ortega ranks third among returning players in most statistical categories. Senior Mason Brinkman and juniors

Travis Kamradt and Trenton Vollink are solid perimeter defenders and compete hard. Junior Keevyn Jacobsma is emerging in the post and can play outside, and senior Wyatt Borden understands where the ball needs to go offensively and works hard to get position defensively. Keith DeBoer and Brenton Thomas are providing great senior leadership.

Whatever lineup is on the floor, Hoaglund wants them to play an up-tempo

"I like to see them run the court hard. Whether it's a steal or a rebound, I want to see us get the ball up the court and immediately try to create an advantage and attack the basket," he noted.

That includes moving Berends outside

more so teams cannot double- and tripleteam him. That should open things up and create opportunities for everyone to get to the rim.

H-M-S also looks to use its athleticism to pressure the ball defensively.


We kind of want to shrink the floor a little bit, get them to a side, make them uncomfortable and work for everything," Hoaglund said. "If they don't have to work for everything, then we're not doing our job."

Hoaglund feels the Hawks need to get to the foul line more often and make a higher percentage of their attempts.

"We shot 60 percent from the free throw line last year and that's not going to cut it if we are to be the team we want to be," he said. "I think we only got 282 attempts. If you look at the teams at the top of our conference they were in the 300s. That tells me that it's probably too many jump shots and we weren't being aggressive enough."

Teams mentioned by Hoaglund as conference contenders were all in the Top 4 of the 2020-21 standings.

"Unity Christian is always tough. Gehlen Catholic is always tough. Remsen St. Mary's is going to be tough," he noted. "And anytime we play South O'Brien it's going to be a tight game."



One possible up-and-comer is West Sioux, which finished fifth.

"They've got some good stuff going down there. I think they are going to be kind of an under-the-radar team," Hoa-

The Hawks' 5-5 record put them in the middle of the standings. It will be challenging to get past the contenders, but Hoaglund thinks H-M-S has the ability to do it.

"It's a tough schedule, but I think we can compete with all of them," he said. "If we can walk away from each and every game knowing we left it all out there – there's nothing in the tank – that's success to me."

# Big expectations await S-O girls this winter

#### Ranked Generals hope to vie for league title

It would be a vast understatement to say Sibley-Ocheyedan's girls' basketball team expects big things this season.

The Generals enter the season ranked No. 8 in Class 2A by the Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union. Twenty girls have reported for practice under Coach Steve Kellen, including two seniors, seven juniors, four

sophomores and seven freshmen.

The Generals return three starters and a total of eight letterwinners from last year's 16-6 season. Back are starters Madison Brouwer, Bria Wasmund and Marissa Ackerman along with letterwinners Abbie Bos, Sydney Richardson, Jadyn Jensen, Keytin Elser and Alayna Wingate. Collectively, the group accounted for 902 the team's 1,187 points a year ago.

This experience is the team's main strength, according to their coach. The Generals are also blessed with height and the skills needed to compete every night and potentially improve upon last year's 16-6 record.

Kellen acknowledged one worry.

"My concern is how fast it takes the underclassmen to feel comfortable in game situations," he said.

With all their returning experience, the Generals are already loaded. Once those underclassmen adjust to the faster game, the squad could have depth coaches dream of having.

Brouwer was a unanimous All-Siouxland pick who totaled 353 points while shooting nearly 50 percent (126/255) from the field, 26.7 percent (10/38) behind the arc and 78.8 percent (91/114) at the free throw line. As a sophomore, she led the team with 206 rebounds, including



# Lower numbers, 7 freshmen add up to young squad

Hawk girls working hard to come together as a team

The Hartley-Melvin-Sanborn girls' basketball program is experiencing a decline

in numbers and an influx of young talent entering the 2021-22 season.

"We'll be at 14 with seven of them freshmen – a pretty young squad," acknowledged Hawk coach Lester Tessum, who is in his third year with the program.

A small roster has both advantages and limitations.

"It's more playing time for the girls, whether it is JV or varsity. It's easier to get girls on the floor," Tessum said. "If you run into a bunch of injuries or things like that, having less numbers can be a bit of a problem. Sometimes the style you play is determined by how many numbers you have so you can rotate."

H-M-S has returning experience from last year's squad which was 5-17 overall. Senior Lydia Harders led H-M-S in scoring, rebounds and steals; and senior Jasmine Lux [honorable mention all-War Eagle] was third in scoring, second in rebounds and tied for the lead in steals.

Senior Emily Otto and juniors Elise Haack and Emily Mutombo are other returners with experience.

Freshmen on the varsity roster are Abby Douma, Gracie Knobloch, Frankie Mohni, Kylee Schiphoff and Eliza Tewes.

"They know the game. They know how it's played, know where to be," Tessum noted. "The freshmen went to a lot of camps and tournaments. They have played a lot of basketball and you can tell."

Despite a lack of numbers and the youth of the squad, Tessum thinks H-M-S has more depth than in recent years.

On the court, Tessum feels the Hawks can be flexible offensively.

"I think that with the group we have, we can run about any type of offense," he said. "We have the ball handlers and enough size in the post to be able to do that."

Defensively, H-M-S will run its 2-3 zone extended, and possibly work into some full-court press. Patience will be a key against teams that apply pressure.

"I think we'll have enough ball handlers and quickness to press and hopefully get a few turnovers," Tessum noted. "As long as we don't get impatient with the ball [against the press] we do pretty well. So we're teaching that 'patience with the ball, they aren't scoring if we've got it' type of attitude, and I think we'll do fine."

He also anticipates that H-M-S will be a

strong offensive rebounding team with size in the post and an offense that is structured so players are in position when shots go up.

Tessum expects another tough campaign in the conference.

"The War Eagle's a tough conference," Tessum acknowledged. "Any night you've got to come out and play your best. I don't care who you're playing."

The Top 2 conference teams in 2020-21 enter this season highly ranked. Unity Christian is No. 1 in Class 3A and MMC-RU is No. 6 in 1A.

"MMCRU is going to be there. Unity is going to be there," Tessum said. "Remsen St. Mary's had a lot of freshmen last year. They'll be a tough out."

The Hawks finished eighth with a 3-7 record. Tessum would like to see this year's squad finish "someplace in the middle."

In addition to achieving the "little goals" that H-M-S sets for each game, Tessum would like to see the squad develop cohesiveness as the season progresses.

"Everybody wants to win. There's none of us that play the game and try not to win," he acknowledged. "For this group being as young as they are, I would say: come together on the court, becoming a team. When you bring that many freshmen into a group it's a lot of learning going on. So coming together as a team to really become a team would be a real good goal for this group."



The Okoboji/H-M-S wrestling room is a crowded place these days. That's because there are over 30 athletes hitting the mats for the 2021-22 season.

This is the third season that H-M-S wrestlers are participating in the combined program with Okoboji. The result is a large squad that is poised to have a successful sea-

Pioneer coach Nate Dau sees several benefits from increasing numbers.

"The more competition we have in the room the more we will grow as a team," he said. "When we have buy-in for the sport of wrestling, everybody improves, which benefits the team."

That commitment has been evident since the end of the 2020-21 season.

Dau is also excited about the group of freshmen entering the program.

"We have a solid freshman class coming in with good numbers and kids with a lot of mat time," he said. "Nathaniel Franklin and James Gellerman (of H-M-S) are both AAU state place winners from last season and will help us in the upper weights. Both have a lot of fight in them and we can't wait to see them compete.

Dau is also happy with the size of the girls' program, which has nearly 10 members.

Central Lyon/George-Little Rock and Sheldon/South O'Brien finished 1-2 last year in the Siouxland Conference dual and individual tournament standings. Okoboji/HMS finished sixth and seventh, respectively. Highest place finishers by the Pioneers were Strantz, second place; Pas, third; Bronstad, fourth; Bryce Dodge (H-M-S, junior, 17-24), Gonnerman and Jones, fifth.
